Scarlet fever is making the rounds so please be extra vigilant.

Symptoms of scarlet fever usually take two to five days to appear after infection. However, the incubation period (the time between exposure to the infection and symptoms starting) can be as short as one day or as long as seven days.

The symptoms of scarlet fever include a sore throat, high temperature (38.3C/101F) or above, headache, flushed face and swollen tongue. The distinctive pink-red rash develops 12 to 48 hours later. **If you suspect your child may have scarlet fever, please take them to a GP as soon as possible.**
