Background

Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. We determine how many pupils in your school attract the funding using data from the January 2018 school census. Schools with 16 or fewer eligible pupils receive £1,000 per pupil. Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of physical education (PE), physical activity and sport you offer. This means that you should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE, physical activity and sport activities that your school already offers
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

33% of our Year 6 cohort for the 2018 to 2019 academic year are working towards the national curriculum requirement to:

- swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 meters
- use a range of strokes effectively
- perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations

Please note as our school is an SEN provision children do not progress at the same rate, although it is statutory to report the National Curriculum attainment data. As our children progress at a slower rate we continue to timetable swimming throughout our post year 6 provision.

Westfield School – Swimming Badge Levels

Level 1 Red Badge (happy in the water):

- Change independently / assist with changing
- Act appropriately in the swimming pool building
- Blow bubbles in the water
- Dip their face in the water / tolerate water being splashed on the face
- Exit the water correctly and safely

Level 2 Green Badge (gaining confidence):

- Walk forwards 5 metres
- Swim 5 metres with buoyancy aids on front or back (assistance may be given)

Level 3 Yellow Badge:

- Swim one width using any stroke, regardless of style (arms and legs must be used)
- Star float on front or back

Level 4 Blue Badge:

- Swim one length either front or back crawl, strongly and efficiently
- Swim one width of the stroke not used for the length
- Push glide on the front
- Push glide on the back
