Background

Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. We determine how many pupils in your school attract the funding using data from the January 2021 school census. Schools with 16 or fewer eligible pupils receive £1,000 per pupil. Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of physical education (PE), physical activity and sport you offer. This means that the school should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE, physical activity and sport activities that your school already offers
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

40% of our Year 6 cohort for the 2021-22 academic year have met the national curriculum requirement to:

20% of our Year 6 cohort for the 2021-22 academic year have met the national curriculum requirement to:

- use a range of strokes effectively

Please note as our school is an SEN provision children do not progress at the same rate, although it is statutory to report the National Curriculum attainment data. As our children progress at a slower rate we continue to timetable swimming throughout our post year 6 provision.
